# ISLAMIC REMINDER

## Exalting, honoring, and revering the Prophet ﷺ

Exalting, honoring, and revering the Prophet ﷺ is a great branch of faith and a fundamental right that our Prophet ﷺ has upon us. Allah Almighty commanded us to do so when He said:

*"Indeed, We have sent you as a witness and a bringer of good tidings and a warner, \* That you [people] may believe in Allah and His Messenger and honor (the prophet ﷺ) him and respect him (the prophet ﷺ)..."*

The Companions رضي الله عنهم loved and revered the Prophet ﷺ with a love and reverence that surpassed all other loves and forms of honor.

It is narrated by Muslim: "The Prophet stayed with Abu Ayyub al-Ansari, staying first in the lower part of the house while Abu Ayyub stayed in the upper part. One night, Abu Ayyub woke up and thought, 'Are we walking above the head of the Messenger of Allah?' So they moved to the side, and then Abu Ayyub said to the Prophet, and the Prophet replied, 'The lower part is more convenient.' But Abu Ayyub said, 'I will never live in a house where you are beneath me.' So the Prophet ﷺ moved to the upper part, while Abu Ayyub stayed in the lower part.

Anas ibn Malik رضي الله عنه narrated:

*"I saw the Prophet ﷺ while the barber was shaving his head, and his Companions were surrounding him, not wanting even a single hair to fall except into the hands of one of them." (Muslim).*

This means they would catch his hair before it fell to the ground and kept it in honor of the Prophet's hair. This highlights the immense love and reverence the Companions had for the Prophet ﷺ. [Muslim]

## The Importance of Reading and Benefits for Children

Assalam Alaikum wa Rahmatullah wa Barakatuh

As we launch our school's exciting readathon, it's a wonderful opportunity to highlight the significance of reading in Islam and the numerous benefits it offers our children.

In Islam, seeking knowledge is considered an act of worship. It is significant that the first word revealed to Prophet Muhammad (SAAW) was 'Read'. The Prophet Muhammad (SAAW) emphasized the importance of education and encouraged us to acquire knowledge from the cradle to the grave. Reading is a fundamental tool for acquiring knowledge and expanding our understanding of the world around us.



### Benefits of Reading for Children:

- Improved cognitive development: Reading helps children develop critical thinking, problem-solving, and imagination.
- Enhanced language skills: Exposure to diverse vocabulary and sentence structures improves children's language abilities.
- Increased empathy and understanding: Reading stories about different cultures and experiences fosters empathy and understanding of others.
- Stronger concentration and focus: Regular reading helps children develop better concentration and focus.
- Spiritual growth: Reading Islamic literature can inspire children and guide them on their spiritual journey. Reading literature and connecting it to our Islamic Values can also train children to analyze and think about what they read, always referring back to Islam as their guide while they evaluate what they read.



### Recommended Children's Authors:

To ensure our children have access to age-appropriate and wholesome reading material, here's a list of authors whose works are appropriate and free of controversial material:

#### Early Readers (Ages 3-5):

- **Eric Carle:** Known for his vibrant illustrations and simple stories, Carle's books often focus on nature, animals, and basic concepts.
- **Margaret Wise Brown:** Her gentle, lyrical stories about animals and nature are timeless favorites.
- **Jan Brett:** Brett's books are known for their beautiful illustrations and stories that often incorporate cultural elements from around the world.
- **David Shannon:** His books usually have a moral and encourage good manners and behaviour
- **Jane Yolen:** Also books focused on good manners
- **Norman Bridwell:** Author of the Clifford Books
- **Mem Fox:** Known for her simple, rhyming stories that are filled with humor and heart.
- **Leo Lionni:** His colorful, abstract stories often explore themes of friendship, perseverance, and self-discovery.
- **Robert McCloskey:** His classic stories are filled with adventure and humor.

#### Young Readers (Ages 6-9)

- **Dr. Seuss:** His books are considered classics for their playful rhymes and imaginative characters. They also have good morals and lessons for children.
- **E.B. White:** His books are known for their wit, humor, and timeless themes.
- **Maurice Sendak:** Sendak's stories often explore dark themes, but they are also filled with imagination and wonder.
- **Beverly Cleary:** Cleary's books are known for their realistic characters and relatable situations.
- **Laura Ingalls Wilder:** Her "Little House" series is a classic series that is filled with adventure and historical detail.
- **James Herriot:** His heartwarming stories about veterinary medicine and life in the countryside are perfect for young readers.
- **Joanna Cole:** Author of "The Magic School Bus" Series with a focus on science and nature.
- **Peggy Parish:** Known for her literal interpretations of language, her "Amelia Bedelia" series is about a beloved character who gets into all sorts of humorous situations.
- **Andrea Beaty:** With themes of STEM, creativity, and problem-solving, Beaty's books celebrate curiosity, innovation, and persistence, making them excellent choices for young readers.
- **Barbara Cooney:** Cooney's books are known for their gentle and heartwarming stories including themes of nature, friendship and kindness.
- 

#### Middle Readers (Ages 10-12)

- **Frances Hodgson Burnett:** Her classic stories are filled with adventure, mystery, and heartwarming themes.
- **Barbara Park:** Junie B. Jones is a feisty and imaginative character who gets into all sorts of adventures.
- **Gertrude Chandler Warner:** Author of "The Boxcar Children" series which follows the adventures of four siblings who live in a secret hideout.

There are also many non-fiction books written for children such as the National Geographic series, the 'Who Was?' Series focused on historical figures and scientists, and many more.

Please be selective with your children's reading material. Some books that are very popular may not be the best choice for children. For example, The "Diary of a Wimpy Kid" series is narrated by a child. Part of the humour includes many spelling and grammatical errors. This might be acceptable for native English speakers as they would know the correct spelling and grammar but we prefer to expose our students to correct grammar and spelling to enhance their literacy.

**Remember, when selecting books, it's essential to preview the content to ensure it aligns with Islamic and with your own family's values.**

We encourage all our students to participate in the readathon and discover the joy and benefits of reading. We hope this event will inspire a lifelong love of reading, learning and exploration of the world.

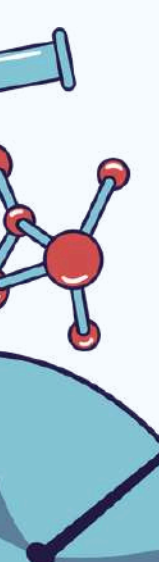
### KICKSTART OF ECA PROGRAMME – 3RD SEPTEMBER

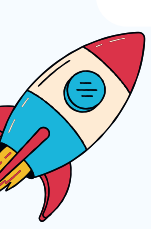

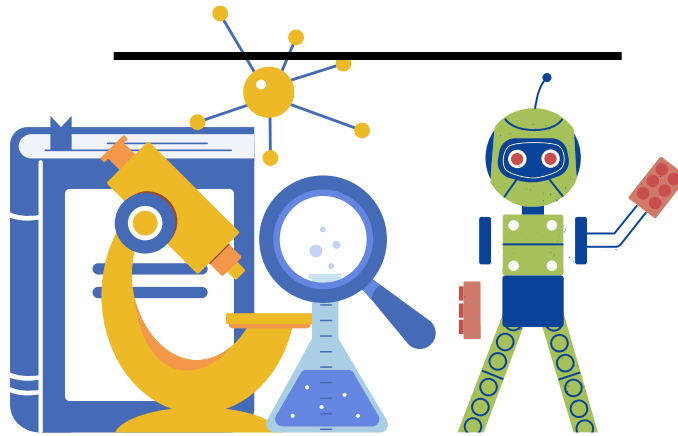

Don't miss the grand finale of our STEAM Fair, where students will present their final projects and innovations, showcasing what they have learned and developed throughout the term.

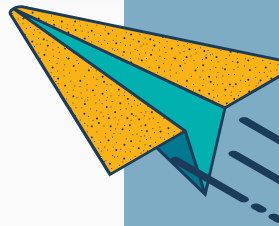

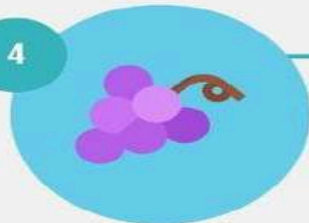
### USE MASK OUTSIDE

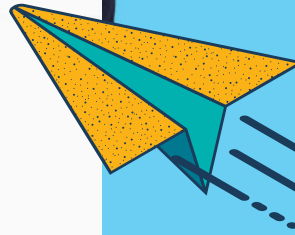
